

SECONDARY EDUCATION PROGRAM (6 - 12)

Students who wish to teach Grades 6-12 or K-12 (offered in art, music, PE, and foreign languages only) must meet the requirements for the liberal arts core, requirements for major and minor concentrations, and requirements for the education sequence. These requirements are all described in the college catalog, which is required reading for every student.

MAJOR AND MINOR CONCENTRATIONS: SECONDARY EDUCATION

Secondary 6-12 and K-12 Programs

Secondary education students must choose a major and a minor. Discuss this with the appropriate major/minor advisors.

Students who major in art, music, physical education, French or Spanish have the option of getting a “K-12 Endorsement” on their secondary teaching certificate. These students are allowed to teach in their major only at the elementary level. If you intend to teach in one of these content areas, it is to your advantage to get the K-12 Endorsement to allow you more job flexibility.

Certifiable majors and minors are determined by the state. The list of majors and minors from which secondary students can choose and the departmental advisor for each area are listed below. Secondary candidates may now select a non-certifiable minor (any minor offered at Calvin) with the understanding that the non-certifiable minor will not be listed on the Michigan teaching certificate.

As soon as you have chosen your major and minor, meet with the appropriate specialty area advisors to complete a **Declaration of Major and/or Minor Program Form. Make a copy of this form for your records and return it to the Registrar.** Once this form is handed in to the Registrar you will have an Academic Evaluation Report (AER) that will list all the courses you need to take to complete the Teacher Education Program.
