- 2) a portfolio (15 pages or less) of your writing that includes a representative sample of scholarly writing. You may also include creative writing in the form of poetry, short fiction, drama, or journalistic essays. (If your scholarly writing is lengthy and the 15-page limit proves prohibitive, consider excerpting your best writing, including your thesis and conclusion, and provide a bracketed abstract of the excised paragraphs.)
In addition,
- 3) if you wish to be considered for the **Kuiper, Schemper-Kamp, or Zylstra** scholarships, submit a 300-500-word statement that explains your career goals.
- 4) if you wish to be considered for the **Van Wienen** Scholarship, submit a 250-400-word statement outlining your interest and service in community social involvement projects.

1. Winifred Holkeboer Memorial Scholarship

Qualifications:

- The candidate must be an English major entering his or her junior or senior year.
- The candidate must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher and a commitment to the study of language and literature.
- The candidate must have demonstrated a potential for leadership within the major.
- The candidate should be able to describe his or her participation in the intellectual life of the campus.

2. Kenneth and Lillian Kuiper Scholarship

Qualifications:

- The candidate must be an English major entering his or her senior year (or the student-teaching year).
- The candidate must be in the secondary education program, majoring in English.
- The candidate must show promise of making a significant contribution as an English teacher in secondary education.
- Financial need may be a consideration.

3. Schemper-Kamp Family Scholarship

Qualifications:

- The candidate must be an English major entering his or her junior or senior year.
- The candidate must have demonstrated academic excellence and a Christian perspective in his or her writing.

4. Henrietta Ten Harmsel English Scholarship

Qualifications:

- The candidate must be a returning English major.
- The candidate must be an enthusiastic reader and writer and must be able to articulate how his or her Christian faith informs their study of literature.

5. Richard R. and Kathleen J. Tiemersma Scholarship

Qualifications:

- The candidate must be an English major entering his or her senior year.
- The candidate must have a GPA of 3.3 or higher.
- The candidate must demonstrate a "respect for language, the liberal arts, and Calvin College and its objectives."

6. William E. and Margaret J. Van Wiene Scholarship

Qualifications:

- The candidate must be an English major entering his or her junior year.
- The candidate must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- The candidate must have an interest and be active in community social involvement projects.
- Financial need may be a consideration.

7. Steve J. and Viola Van Der Wee Scholarship

Qualifications:

- The candidate must be an English major entering his or her junior or senior year.
- The candidate must have demonstrated academic excellence.
- The candidate must “show evidence of coming to maturity through a liberal arts education and of enriching the Christian community through those studies.”
- Financial need may be a consideration.

8. Henry and Mildred Zylstra Memorial Scholarship

- The candidate must be an English major entering his or her senior year.
- The candidate must have a GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- The candidate must be planning to attend graduate school to study literature or language within five years following graduation.
