

# Cumulative Music GPA

If you are a music major or music minor, you can find your cumulative music GPA on your academic evaluation report.

If not, this is the process to use:

## Grade Point Scale:

<b>A</b>	4.0
<b>A-</b>	3.7
<b>B+</b>	3.3
<b>B</b>	3.0
<b>B-</b>	2.7
<b>C+</b>	2.3
<b>C</b>	2.0
<b>C-</b>	1.7
<b>D+</b>	1.3
<b>D</b>	1.0
<b>D-</b>	.7

Multiply number of credits for course and the grade you received for that class together. Take this number and divide by total number of credits taken. This will give you your Cumulative Music GPA.

For example:

Music History: 4 credits A-

Introduction to Music: 3 credits B+

Take 4 and multiply by corresponding grade point: 3.7. This will give you 14.8. Next take 3 and multiply by corresponding grade point: 3.3. This will give you 9.9. Now add these two sums together (14.8+9.9). You will get a total of 24.7. Take this number and divide by total number of credits taken. In this example, you would divide by 7. Your cumulative Music GPA is 3.528.
