

ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

Mandate:

The Environmental Stewardship Committee shall be responsible to:

1. Be an advocate on behalf of the Calvin community on environmental matters.
2. Serve as a structure for the exchange of information and communication among the decision-making units that influence the environment.
3. Help the Vice President for Administration, Finance, and Information Services prioritize projects.
4. Set standards and guidelines much as the Information Services Committee and Campus Accessibility Advisory Committee do within their mandates.
5. Hold the Planning and Priorities Committee accountable to environmental concerns as stated in the Strategic Plan.

Reporting Relationship:

The Environmental Stewardship Committee will report to the Faculty Senate.

Composition:

Ten members: Director of the Ecosystem Preserve (or designee), Director of the Calvin Environmental Assessment Program, Director of Physical Plant (or designee), Coordinator of Recycling Program, two at-large faculty members one of which shall be chair (preferably from among faculty involved in CEAP, but with the goal of broad divisional representation), student representative of the Environmental Stewardship Coalition, Student Senate representative, Vice President for Administration, Finance, Information and Service (ex officio), and College Architect (ex officio)
