Who should fill out this form?

This form is for residents and citizens of Canada. Students who also have U.S. citizenship must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (www.fafsa.ed.gov) in addition to this form to be considered for U.S. financial aid.

New Calvin students who choose not to complete this form but would still like to receive the Canadian Exchange Grant may download a separate application at www.calvin.edu/finaid/forms.

When should I fill out this form?

Prospective first-year and transfer students should complete this form after January 1 but before April 1, 2009.

Returning students should complete this form after January 1 but before June 1, 2009.

Applications received late will be considered, although funds are limited in some programs.

When will I hear about the results?

Filling out the Canadian Financial Aid Form

- Report all figures in **Canadian dollars** unless indicated otherwise.
- If the instructions tell you to skip a question or set of questions, you can leave it blank. *If a question does not apply to you, do not leave it blank – put a zero in the answer space.*
- Because you need to provide family financial information, you will need the following records:
 - 2008 Canadian Income Tax Return
 - T4 and other documentation of 2008 income
 - Current bank statements
 - Business and farm records
 - Elementary/secondary school tuition payments
 - Medical and dental payments in 2008
 - Untaxed income
- Special circumstances are to be explained in question #31 of this form.
- It is strongly recommended that you complete your tax return before filling out this form. The line references are based on the 2007 tax return and may be different if changed on the 2008 tax return. If you are unable to complete your tax return at this time, use your best estimates. The Office of Admissions and Financial Aid may request a copy of your tax return at a later date to verify certain information.
- Make a photocopy of the completed form for your files.
