SUMMER FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

Denominational Grant – This is a grant given to members of the Christian Reformed Church to recognize regular contributions received from families in the denomination. The amount of the grant is \$25 per semester hour for Michigan and non-Michigan residents. No separate application is necessary.

Federal Pell Grant – This is a grant funded by the federal government for U.S. citizens and eligible non-citizens with high need. Need is determined by filing the FAFSA (Free Application for Student Financial Aid). The Financial Aid Office will determine eligibility. The financial aid forms must be filed to be considered for this grant. To be considered for the Federal Pell Grant, please complete the reverse side of this form and return it to the Office of Admissions and Financial Aid.

Federal TEACH Grant - This is a grant funded by the federal government for U.S. citizens and eligible non-citizens who intend to teach. The grant is for those who plan to teach in a public or private elementary or secondary school that serves students from low-income families. To be considered for the Federal TEACH Grant, entrance counseling must be completed (see the How to Apply section on the website).

Federal Direct Subsidized and Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loans – Federal Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans are low-interest, long term loans for educational expenses. The U.S. Department of Education is the lender for the Direct Loans. The subsidized loan is interest free while the student is in school and continues to be enrolled at least half-time, during the 6-month grace period, and during certain periods of deferment. The unsubsidized loan is not interest-free during the in-school, grace period, and deferment periods. Most students who complete the FAFSA and who are enrolled at least half-time during the summer are eligible for either of these loans or a combination of the two. A summer loan may affect the amount of loan the student will receive during the following academic year.
