

## SURVEY OF HAZARD ASSESSMENT FOR PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

### Building Services

**EYE AND FACE PROTECTION** - appropriate eye and/or face protection is required when employees are in areas where there is exposure to eye and face hazards from flying particles, molten metal, liquid chemicals, acids, caustic liquids, chemical gases or vapors or potentially injurious light radiation. All eye protection must be ANSI approved.

ACTIVITY	HAZARD	TYPE OF PPE	AFFECTED DEPARTMENTS/JOB TITLES
<b>IMPACT</b> Leaf blowing, dusting high surfaces, changing fluorescent lamps	Flying fragments, objects, large chips, particles, sand, dirt, etc.	Spectacles with side protection, goggles, or face shield. Face shields should be used for severe exposure and can only be worn over primary eye protection (glasses or goggles). Persons whose vision requires the use of prescription lenses must wear either protective devices fitted with prescription lenses or protective devices designed to be worn over regular prescription eye wear.	Service Director, Housekeeper, Building Services Supervisor, Building Services Manager, Custodian, Student Laborer.
<b>CHEMICALS</b> Chemical handling, diluting cleaning solutions	Splash, irritating mists, etc.	Spectacles with side protection or goggles.	Service Director, Housekeeper, Building Services Supervisor, Building Services Manager, Custodian
Tylenol to clean showers	Splash, irritating mists, etc.	Spectacles with side protection or goggles.	Student Laborer.

**Foot Protection** - appropriate foot protection is required when employees are in areas where there is danger of foot injuries due to falling and rolling objects, slip hazards or objects piercing the sole, and where employees are exposed to electrical hazards. All foot protection must be ANSI approved.

ACTIVITY	HAZARD	TYPE OF PPE	AFFECTED DEPARTMENTS/JOB TITLES
All activities	general	Closed-toe shoes	Service Director, Housekeeper, Building Services Supervisor, Building Services Manager, Custodian, Student Laborer.

**HAND PROTECTION** - appropriate hand protection is required when employees are in areas where their hands are exposed to skin absorption of harmful substances, severe cuts or lacerations, severe abrasions, punctures, chemical burns, thermal burns or harmful temperature extremes. Appropriate gloves are dependent upon the type of chemical contaminant or physical hazard. Special care must be taken when selecting gloves for chemical exposure to assure glove is resistant to the chemical in question.

ACTIVITY	HAZARD	TYPE OF PPE	AFFECTED DEPARTMENTS/JOB TITLES
Handling chemicals, Handling trash, changing fluorescent lamps	chemicals, biological hazards, broken lamps	chemical resistant gloves including but not limited to vinyl, latex, rubber, nitrile, neoprene (special care must be taken when selecting gloves for chemical usage to assure they are resistant and won't allow breakthrough to the skin)	<b>Custodial Services</b> – Service Director, Housekeeper, Building Services Supervisor, Building Services Manager, Custodian, Student Laborer.
