MISSION. Founded in 1876 by the Christian Reformed Church, Calvin College is a comprehensive liberal arts college in the Reformed tradition of historic Christianity. LOCATION. Grand Rapids, Michigan, the second largest metropolitan area in Michigan, with a population of about 650,000.
