Multicultural Student Development Office Events

- Seven Days in the Black World: a week-long celebration of the contributions of African-Americans to the formation of our country. The week included guest lectures, films, daily trivia contests, and open forums. College students spent a morning reading African/African-American children's stories at two local elementary schools.
- Cesar Chavez Week: This was the first event organized to honor the work of Cesar Chavez; it is to become an annual event. The Multicultural Student Advisory Board joined with the Social Justice Committee to organize a Sweat Shop Simulation which educated students about working conditions and pay in many underdeveloped countries. Dr. Mark Rodriguez, History and Law professor at Notre Dame, delivered a timely lecture on the history of Migrant Farm Works in the Midwest.

Student Mentoring

- Ninety-three students participated in active mentoring relationships with a member of the Calvin community in 2005-06, up from 82 students in 2004-05.
- 2006-07 mentoring scholarships (\$1,000 each) were renewed for 36 students, and 64 were awarded to students new to the mentoring program.

Service-Learning Center

- The Service-Learning Center administered seven trips, which involved more than 80 students and five faculty/staff mentors who traveled to Port Gibson, MS; Houma, LA; Mossport, MS; Kansas City, MO; Knoxville, TN; Boston, MA; and Rehoboth, NM.
- On March 9, 2006, the Service-Learning Center celebrated 40 years of sending students into the Grand Rapids community as volunteers and service-learners. Seventy-five former staff members, student volunteers, and agency partners gathered to hear keynote speaker Jennifer Markham who is presently the executive director of Safe Haven Ministries and a former student staff member of the Service-Learning Center.
