#### Making Sense of the Reformation in 1 Day

I. Date: 7/10/09 Subject: World Geography
Grade Level: 9<sup>th</sup> Teacher: Jayson Evaniuck

- II. **Main Focus:** For students to have basic understanding of the differences between Protestant and Roman Catholic Christianity that developed during the Reformation period.
- III. **Objectives**: TLW analyze differences between Roman Catholic, Calvinist, Anabaptist and Lutheran belief systems and their practices.
- IV. **Prerequisite Skills:** Knowledge of basic beliefs of Christianity. Understanding of the terms salvation, saints, baptism.
- V. Lesson Mode: Guided lecture and cooperative learning groups in a 90 minute block






