## COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

### **Chief Justice William Hubbs Rehnquist**

William Rehnquist, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States, has served on the Court since 1972. He was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in 1924. He attended public elementary and high schools in Shorewood, Wisconsin, a suburb of Milwaukee, served in the United State Army Air Corps in this country and overseas from 1943 to 1946, and was discharged having attained the rank of sergeant.

He attended Stanford University, where he received his B.A. and M.A. (Phi Beta Kappa). He was awarded an M.A. from Harvard University in 1950 and returned to Stanford, where he earned his LL.B. in 1952 (Order of the Coif).

From February 1952 to June 1953 he served as a clerk to Supreme Court Justice Robert H. Jackson. He engaged in private general law practice in Phoenix,

Arizona, from 1953 to 1969 and was appointed Assistant Attorney General, Office of Legal Counsel, by President Richard Nixon in 1969. He was nominated to the Supreme Court of the United States in 1971, and he was sworn in on January 7, 1972. In 1986, he was nominated to be the Chief Justice of the United States by President Ronald Reagan and was sworn in on September 26, 1986.

Chief Justice Rehnquist was active in professional, civic, and church affairs while living in Phoenix. He has been a contributor of articles on legal subjects to various periodicals. He married Natalie Cornell of San Diego, California, now deceased, and they have three children. The family currently resides in Bethesda, Maryland, where they are members of Emmanuel Lutheran Church.

## MESSAGE FROM THE FIFTY-YEAR-REUNION CLASS

Whatever you do and wherever you go, remember God's words: "Show me your ways, O Lord, teach me your paths; guide me in your truth and Teach me, for you are my Lord and Savior, and my hope is in you all day long." Psalm 25: 4,5.

## DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI

### **Chaplain (Colonel) Herman Keizer, Jr.'65**

Matthew 18:20 has a very special place in the heart of Colonel Herman Keizer '65. "I discovered very early on in my ministry that this passage took on a new sense of meaning in combat: 'Wherever two or three are gathered in my name, there I am with them.'"

During his early days as an Army chaplain, Keizer was assigned to the 1<sup>st</sup> Infantry Division in Vietnam.

"I remember going down Thunder Road where there would be soldiers in tanks or track vehicles guarding the road. I would sit and talk with them or read scripture," he said. "I also found that they really wanted to worship. I began to use the sacrament to help that worship. The symbols of communion were very meaningful. We could all identify with Christ's broken body. Faith in his suffering brought healing to the death they saw around them. It gave hope for an uncertain future."

In his 33-year military career, Keizer's most inspirational memories are of his time in the field.

"Thinking about combat ministry 30 years later is still a very emotional experience," he said. "That is when you are really faced with the possibility of your death and the hard question of what it means to love your enemies."

As a young Army chaplain, Keizer was wounded by enemy fire in Cambodia, for which he was awarded a Purple Heart. He also was severely injured in a 150-foot fall from a helicopter when it lost the tail rotor and began to spin wildly. Keizer was hurled out the open door.

While these early difficulties challenged Keizer, he

never thought of leaving his ministry.

"You think about the fact that if you weren't there, all of these soldiers would be without the keeper of the Good News," he said. "There are always times in combat when you are afraid, but there is also the assurance that you're exactly where God wants you to be."

That assurance has sustained Keizer throughout his long and distinguished ministry.

"There were times when I was caught up in bureaucratic assignments that I really questioned chaplain ministry. God always came along and showed me that I was exactly where I was supposed to be," he said.

Keizer's assignments for the next three decades included working as special advisor on the drug and alcohol program, both in the United States and later in Germany. He was appointed officer-in-charge of the Drug and Alcohol Training School in Bremerhaven, Germany. He also served on the faculty of the Army Chaplains School. Later Keizer was assigned to the staff of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel, the Human Relations Directorate, Leadership Division. Keizer was involved in several major policy initiatives which helped improve the lives of Army personnel, including authoring the policy on Accommodation of Religious Practices in the Armed Services and the Army Family Action Planning Process.

"As a clergyman, I had direct influence on a general who set policy for the entire Army," said Keizer. "To influence policy for the good made it very clear that God was at work."

During the 1990s, Keizer's assignment was as Command Chaplain of the United States European Command. His leadership led to the establishment of chaplaincies in Central European nations, the forging of cooperation among chaplains in the North American Treaty Organizations and the direction of three highly successful European-North American Chiefs of Military Chaplains Conferences.

"What I learned from all of these experiences is the scope and breadth of God's Kingdom," said Keizer. "I have a tremendous respect for how God works in this world. As part of my European command I worked to reestablish a chaplaincy in countries in the former Soviet Union. If you had told me early in my career that I would stand in uniform in Red Square without having fought a war, I never would have believed it. Working with these

clergy from many different faith communities was a powerful testimony to how God keeps his church alive.”

Keizer said both Calvin College and Calvin Theological Seminary, from which he graduated in 1968, helped him learn the scope and power of God’s mission in the world right from the start of his ministry.

“Calvin taught me that God’s mission is bigger than the mission he gives to the church. A view of God’s mission in the world is much broader, much more full, than just a denomination’s or a local congregation’s,” he said. “I learned that the same church that established Calvin College as an educational institution and was willing to ordain chaplains to minister in special settings, can help make the Kingdom of God come on a battlefield or in a hospital or in a foreign nation.”

Since his official retirement in 1998, Keizer has been called back to active duty. His first assignment was a major research project for the Secretary and Chief of Staff of the Army. He was one of two leaders of teams made up of enlisted soldiers and Army research professionals who surveyed and interviewed soldiers and leaders on the current state of leadership and human relations in the Army.

Currently, he is working as an advisor for the Ambassador-at-Large for International Religious Freedom in the State Department. In this position he is responsible for monitoring religious freedom issues in all of Africa and the Balkans. Religious freedom is a vital part of the United States foreign policy and is a daily concern of this office.

Keizer’s awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Medal with One Oak Leaf Cluster; the Legion of Merit with Three Oak Leaf Clusters; the Soldier’s Medal; the Bronze Star Medal with Five Oak Leaf Clusters and V (Valor) Device; the Purple Heart; Meritorious Service Medal with Three Oak Leaf Clusters; the Air Medal with 3 Device; the Army Commendation Medal with One Oak Leaf Cluster; the Army Medal of Achievement Medal with One Oak Leaf Cluster; and the Good Conduct Medal.

Of his career Keizer added, “It’s been an exciting ministry. The Army is a dynamic place to be. Our church has the kind of theological balance and the worldview that gives us value in the specialized settings where chaplains minister. Christian Reformed chaplains have really contributed outstanding

ministry for the CRC in these special places. We should all praise God for these ministries.”

Chaplain Keizer is married to Ardis Groeneveld Keizer ’63. They are the parents of two sons, Bryan and Randall.

### **Jacquelyn Mabin Nickerson ‘55**

On Union Avenue, just north of Franklin Street in Grand Rapids, lived the Mabin family, the only African-American family in the neighborhood in the 1940s. Young Jacquie Mabin grew up surrounded by Dutch Christian Reformed people.

“I was fascinated by these Dutch folk,” recalled Jacquie, who now goes by the full name and title of Dr. Jacquelyn Nickerson, Associate Professor of Education, Emerita, Michigan State University.

“The Dutch people would spend entire Saturdays cleaning their homes and scrubbing their porches,” she said. “I thought it was neat that they cared so much about their homes and community.”

The Mabins attended First Community African Methodist Episcopal Church on James and Logan. Jacquie sang in the choir.

“I remember my early days of schooling at Madison School,” she said. “I always enjoyed school. I was a shy girl and school work gave me a focus away from the outside world.”

Jacquie’s mom, a former teacher in a one-room schoolhouse in Arkansas, fueled the youngster’s classroom successes. Her other major interest – travel – came from her father. Since Jacquie’s dad was a mechanic for the Pere Marquette railroad, the family received free train travel.

Jacquie always assumed she would go to college and had some interesting choices. Her uncle and aunt from Los Angeles offered to pay for her college tuition at either USC or UCLA. But shortly after the time of her June, 1948 graduation, her dad passed away.

“I had to stay home,” Jacquie said of that difficult time.

She began her schooling at Grand Rapids Junior College in social work, but changed to pre-education. She worked summers at the United Methodist Community House and the Urban League Community Center as a youth leader and nursery attendant.

To finish her college years, Jacquie turned to an unlikely choice for African-Americans at that time: Calvin College.

“Calvin was the epitome of educational excellence,” said Jacquie. “The scholarship was high and the school was so well respected. I figured I could go to an outstanding school right in my own backyard.”

It was a challenge to be one of just three African Americans on the Franklin campus, because she felt as though she was always the focus of attention. “I talked my husband-to-be, Don, into attending Calvin, too,” she said. “He started in mid-year after me, and eventually graduated with a degree in chemistry.”

Jacquie and Don were married in 1952 and soon after, son Jeffrey was born. Jacquie dropped out of Calvin briefly to care for her son while Don finished his program. But she was determined to finish and become a teacher.

“I remember walking to my mother’s house with baby Jeffrey, leaving him there and then walking to Calvin for classes,” she said. “Some winter days were awful and those blocks seemed so long, but I was motivated and my mother was supportive through prayer and taking care of my son.”

Jacquie graduated with an education degree. Her favorite course at Calvin was philosophy, with legendary professor William Harry Jellema. In fact, on a living room table in her East Lansing, Mich., home, are three ornately bound volumes with a Calvin pedigree.

“I’ve kept my three textbooks from Professor Jellema’s class all these years,” she said. “I know the importance of ideas and training the mind.” She’s turned down offers by friends to buy them – Plato’s *Republic*, Plato’s *Dialogues*, and *Of the Nature of Things*, by Lucretius. Written inside: “Jacquelyn Mabin, Calvin College.”

After graduation, Jacquie landed a teaching job at Coldbrook School on the north side of Grand Rapids. After five years of teaching, she applied to a new venture at Michigan State University for training student teachers, called the Elementary Intern Program. Jacquie worked as an intern consultant, providing opportunities for central-city students and teachers.

In 1966, husband Don received a Ph.D. from Michigan State and accepted an appointment in the university’s education department. At the same time,

Jacquie was offered a position at MSU’s Mott Institute for Community Improvement. She developed field experiences in urban education in Detroit, Flint, and Lansing. During this time, Michigan Governor William Milliken appointed her to the Northern Michigan University Board of Governors, where she eventually served as chairperson.

“At-risk children have problems in school,” she said, “but these problems can be solved. Kids feel good about themselves when they learn, so the solid academics must be partnered with an understanding of child development and how to reach different kids.”

Jacquie has continued her interest in urban education as a speaker and consultant and is currently the co-leader of a mentoring group that has taken 25 middle school girls from the Lansing Public School system under its wing.

“Children, especially those who live in our cities, need positive people and positive messages. We must always try to provide inspiring and uplifting experiences,” she said.

In retirement, Jacquie takes more time for gardening and traveling and to serve her church, All Saints Episcopal, as a Lay Eucharistic Minister II (which means taking and administering the sacrament to the sick and shut-in). She’s also particularly proud of son Jeffrey and daughter Susan and her three grandchildren.

There is one other cause about which she’s become passionate in recent years. “I feel very blessed,” she said. “Although my husband Don passed away in 1996 and I have overcome a bout with breast cancer, I think about God’s goodness and strength and draw upon those things.” Jacquie has since counseled at least a dozen women who also have breast cancer and sees that as a new ministry to which God has called her.

From Union Avenue to Calvin College to urban education expert, Jacquelyn Nickerson sought God’s leading and displayed uncommon determination to help others. Her bright smile and gracious demeanor portray a life of dignified grace and persistent optimism.

“My mother’s prayers got through,” she said. “She was a teacher; I was a teacher. We’re all teachers in some way. With prayer and good teachers along the way, amazing things can happen.”

## DEPARTMENTAL BANNERS

Throughout history, colorful banners have been used to mark important religious and civic events and to celebrate the vision and spirit of the participants in such events. The departmental banners displayed at this occasion arise from an awareness of this tradition and are meant to continue it. Besides symbolically revealing the richness of the various disciplines at Calvin College, the banners graphically represent their distinctiveness. Although their colors are mostly in keeping with traditional associations—scarlet for religion and theology, blue for education, orange for engineering—their forms combine the traditional, the contemporary, and the abstract.

### Art Department

An abstract eye and hand symbolize artistic expression through the artist's sense of sight and touch. Bright colors against black suggest creative boldness.

### Biology Department

Dominating the biology banner is a symbol representing the structure of the DNA molecule, deoxyribonucleic acid. The structure of this fundamental material of life, the chemical basis of heredity, was revealed in 1953 and actually photographed in 1969.

### Chemistry and Biochemistry Department

The main symbol used in this banner is the electron distribution for tetrahedral hybrid orbitals, which represents the chemical activity of the elements and their compounds. Two segments of a crystal structure are included in the design, which are also the floor-plan shape of the science building. The shaft of pale yellow symbolizes the light of investigation. Yellow is the traditional color associated with science.

### Classical Languages Department

While the lyre and the wolf may be taken individually as symbols of Greece and Rome, together they portray the unity of the two civilizations and its cultural achievement, the union of art and nature, and of poetry and myth. Horace has given this continuity and fusion of the two traditions of Greece and Rome its classical literary expression in his odes, of which none better, perhaps, than the "Integer vitae" ode conveys the intention of this banner.

### Communication Arts and Sciences Department

Sound waves emanating from a central core symbolize communication through speech and drama. The reversal of the outward movement suggests feedback in communication. Silver gray is the color traditionally assigned to speech and drama.

### Computer Science Department

The banner of the Computer Science Department features a Turing machine, the foundational model of digital computation. The zeroes and ones on its tape reflect the binary logic by which digital computation is implemented. The changing colors and order of the numbers express the transition as data move from input through processing to output. The white shaft and its golden sheath symbolize the light and energy of education and the sciences. The flowing wind symbolizes the transforming work of the Holy Spirit as it infuses the discipline of computing.

### **Economics and Business Department**

Shapes and lines express the charting and planning of economic budgets. Subtly appearing among other symbols is a cross expressing the Christ-centered teaching of economics at Calvin College. Copper is the color associated with economics.

### **Education Department**

The relationship of teacher and student in the educational process is represented by the forceful interaction of shapes in this design. The white shaft symbolizes the light of learning in the Holy Spirit. Blue is traditionally linked with education.

### **Engineering Department**

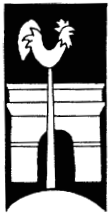
The Engineering banner illustrates the key activity of engineers, namely, their involvement with the design process, an iterative, decision-making sequence. Steps in the sequence, represented by circles and rectangles, are connected by arrows to indicate the movement from the initial problem statement to final solution. Two-way arrows suggest the possibility of sequence reversal. Orange traditionally designates engineering.

### **English Department**

The two main symbols, the lion and the eagle, represent England and the United States of America. The lozenge pattern in the background expresses the pageantry of England during the development of the English language.

### **French Department**

The banner of the Department of French features the Coq Gaulois, long a national emblem of France, and the Arch of Triumph, a symbol of French patriotism. The cock, traditionally the Christian symbol for watchfulness, has been adopted as its symbol by a nation which since its inception has been one of the important cradles of Christian thought and practice. The colors of the national flag are represented by the Coq Gaulois.

### **Geology, Geography, and Environmental Studies Department**

Earthkeeping, the human community's care for God's earth, is symbolized in the banner for the Department of Geology, Geography, and Environmental Studies by representations of atmosphere, mountains, cities, water, and the various levels of the earth's interior. The white shaft symbolizes the light and energy of learning stimulated by the Holy Spirit.

### **Germanic Languages Department**

The study of the Dutch and German languages is represented by symbols taken from emblems of the countries associated with these languages. The traditional black eagle represents Germany, and the orange lion is from the seal of the Netherlands. The white shaft symbolizes the light of learning.

Engaged in exercise, sports, and dance, a person in motion is suggested by the movement of rhythmical shapes and lines. Sage green is the color associated with physical fitness.

### History Department

Jagged horizontal bands, representing both the rise and fall of civilizations and the four kingdoms as described in the Book of Daniel, move across vertical time lines, which also symbolize the dramatic influence of Christ on history.

### Library

The library as a gatherer, receptacle, and distributor of information, ideas, and learning is represented by the abstract book shape, while the white, flowing shaft itself symbolizes the light and energy of learning in the Holy Spirit of God. The flame is the traditional symbol of learning and discovery through research.

### Mathematics and Statistics Department

Mathematicians have always saved time and effort by substituting symbols for words. The basic arithmetical steps of adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing are depicted on this banner by some of the earliest ways of writing them down.

The Renaissance calculator Tartaglia used the first letter of the Italian word for *plus* to signify adding. Diophantus favored this minus sign in Greek times. Leibniz employed this multiplication symbol in 17th-century Germany. J. E. Gallimard used this reverse *D* for division in 18th-century France.

### Music Department

The design of the Music banner emphasizes the rhythms of musical sounds. Shapes and lines suggest strings, valves, keys, horn bell, drum, and other musical forms. Radiating circles suggest sound waves. The colors express the various moods of music.

### Nursing Department

The traditional emblem of nursing, Florence Nightingale's lamp, is featured in the banner for the Department of Nursing. The flame of the lamp symbolizes the light of Christian compassion and education. The gold of the lamp is the traditional color for science. The background apricot color is the academic regalia color for nursing, while the white shaft represents peace through the Holy Spirit.

### Philosophy Department

Light refracted through a transparent prism symbolizes the many-faceted investigations of fact and of principles of reality and of human nature and conduct.

### Physics and Astronomy Department

The construction of elements is symbolized in the Physics banner by the simplest atom, hydrogen, with its single proton and electron. Also included in the design are a tracing of the paths of particles from an atom and a segment of a crystal structure which is also the floor-plan shape of the science building. The yellow shaft symbolizes the light of investigation.

### **Political Science Department**

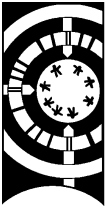
The banner of the Department of Political Science features a representation of the fasces, a symbol of the authority of the state, and arrows that express the direction and flow of the analytical and holistic nature of the process of law. The fasces, a bundle of rods bound about by an ax with projecting blade, was carried before ancient Roman magistrates as a symbol of authority. The white shaft of seven rods also symbolizes peace and enlightenment through the Holy Spirit.

### **Psychology Department**

The Greek letter *PSI*, the first letter of the Greek word *psyche* (the mind), traditionally signifies the discipline of psychology. The color red symbolizes emotion; blue, rationality; and white, peace through the Holy Spirit.

### **Religion and Theology Department**

Three symbols of the Trinity—circle, cross, and dove—express the fullness of God as He reveals Himself as Creator, Savior, and Counselor. These symbols are interlocked to depict the oneness of God. The shaft of white is the light of learning in Christian education guided by the Holy Spirit. Scarlet is traditionally associated with theology.

### **Sociology, Social Work, and Criminal Justice Department**

The central concept of sociology, represented by the inner circle, is a person interacting with other people to form groups. Total human society, represented by the broken circle, is composed of many small units forming a larger interrelated structure. All groups, from the family to society itself, exist within a framework of social norms. This normative or cultural framework, represented by the unbroken outer circle, promotes conformity, as suggested by the arrows directed from it toward the inner circles of society and the smaller group.

The banner of the Spanish Department features the traditional symbols of the historical kingdoms of Castilla (castle), León (lion), and Aragón (red and yellow bars). These Christian kingdoms emerged during the eight-hundred-year-long reconquest of the Iberian Peninsula from domination by Muslim rulers. The separate kingdoms were joined through the marriage of Ferdinand and Isabella, and eventually coalesced into the modern nation of Spain.
