Transitioning to Fall — 2021

Thanks again for supporting Calvin students in so many unique ways this year. Your good work in the class-room and collaboration with support systems is so important to helping students persevere through struggle and continue at Calvin. **Thank you!!**

A few reminders and updates:

Returning Students—At this time in the academic calendar, the Student Success team is actively following-up with students who did not register for fall or who indicated that they are leaving Calvin (or considering it) before earning their degree. If you are aware of students who are unsure about their plans for next year, please take a few moments to complete the <u>student concern form</u>. Your submission is reviewed by student success staff and provides the team with key information for follow-up.

Incoming students—Based on popular demand, the advising process for new students is no longer tied to the summer orientation sessions. After our pilot last summer, advisors reported that they appreciated:

- Flexibility of scheduling appointments when most convenient for the advisor and student
- Minimizing travel to campus to advise for a short period of time
- Connecting 1:1 with students online, rather than expanding the conversation to parents
- Beginning a partnership with students who they knew would be their advisees in the fall

We are planning that advisors will schedule remote appointments with assigned first-year students during the month of June in preparation for registration in July. The advising team will be sending advising rosters and additional advising information to advisors in late May.
