Brant must have writen about the old little brick from your old house. We are with seven people, brothers and sisters. Now Ykje, the letter is almost filled. I hope you can read it will. My handwriting does not become better if one is 77 years. I must write, my wife is strong, she is 74 years. people, especially greetings to all.

I thought I will not let the grass grow under my feet, and write back right away. Now, from us too, many blessings in this new year. What the future might bring is hidden for us, but known to God. We hope that you will be spared from disaster and adversity in this new year. We are healthy and that is the most important thing. Our children are also healthy and the grand and greatgrandchildren too. We are getting older. My husband becomes 79 on March 17 and I am 75 and healthy. Sybe is now always vigorous but has sometimes the same as his mother, she was also very nervous. Brant has read the letter and my son too where your son stayed. I will let the other brothers and sisters read the letter. They come and visit us once in a while. Uncle Sybe s sister lives in Pingjum. She is 78 already and Metje lives in Bolsward. She is Catholic, has had 13 children, has lost two children during the war and an other two due to illness. So she went through a lot. There is snow and it is cold at the moment. Not a long winter however. It was bad at some places with the snow, but not in Franeker, happily. We had a wet summer here. Many spotted potatoes. are large areas which have to be ploughed under immediately, damage for the farmer. Brandt gives you his regards too, he has received a letter from Siebe this summer. We read it too. I do not know you but nevertheless it is fun if you have family whom wants to write with you. Then there is still contact. Your children are healthy also, now that is good. You can greet

your husband and the children from that strange aunt and from uncle Sybe. If you would see Franeker now then you would look surprised although perhaps you cannot remember anything from it. There is almost a whole city added. If you look from the back of the house where you lived once; a paperfactory and a canal digged through it, all potatowarehouses and a new shipyard. Then the Dongjumerpoort. Och, I believe, there a half city has been added and then behind the "Bolwerk" near the gasfactory whole neighborhoods. I write this, perhaps you can understand what I am writing about, near the "Suikerlam" were they always "kaatsen". Now you know a lot again or perhaps nothing. But I cannot think of much to write about and my husband tells me to write back. Now I am doing this hartly and I hope and pray that it will be given to you to receive these lines in healthyness and that we may hear something from you. We have been to Groningen last winter, but in the winter it is impossible, so now we stay home. The costs are high and you are nowhere better than in your home. We have a daughter living there. I end now and give the regards especially from us and from the children to your husband and you and to your children.

I have a pension of 400 guilders a month inclusive everything but I can take care of myself. We do not need much. Brant is not far from here. He remarried again, i guite often visit them and they me. You wrote about nature, it was here beautiful this summer, very dry but much sunshine. Your husband retires from work, now I hope that it will be given to you that you may stay together for many years. Because the older you become the less you can miss eachother. Your children are healthy too, you wrote, happily, it is good for the parents. I was frightened when I received a letter from America. I thought they think about us. And I hope that you will write me back some time. I do not know you but I feel there is a need to hear something about Friesland. I do not know much about your family but I knew where you lived. Mu husband talked always about uncle Klaas and aunt. Sybe is the first whom died. There are

now 6 children left of uncle Jan and Bepkje. They all are very healthy.

More I do not know. Now I am going to end because mu letter is almost

filled and I wish you God s best blessing and a happy 1960. Give my regards
to your husband and other family.

My gall and highblood pressure bothered me last winter, but I am recovering now. It is here a wet and cold spring. I can imagine that my husbands brother receives respondence back from your brother Sam. quiet now that I am alone, although I fight my way through it. I can do my work will and that is great. On sundays I go to church regularly. I have here two married children but each have their own persuits. Brand underwent surgery this last winter and that does not go to will yet He is doing well, only his health is not improving. Your pears and other fruit bring the water to my mouth. It is not that easy here and it is expensive. I do not have a large home but that is not necessary too, since everything is different in Friesland. A brother of my husband, jelle, visited me this week. He gave me his address; Jelle Sybesma, 277a Achlum. He would like to have a letter from you sometimes. He also had a big blow, his daughter only 27 year, married, has lost her husband, 32 years old. She is expecting a second child, she is a nice girl. She lives in the polder. I will become 80 years on October 19, if I live. So you are dealing with an old lady, but I hope that the Lord may let me experience

another birthday. And now I end with wishes of much health for you and your husband, that the Lord may be close to you. This is the wish from me.
