Trustee: As you walk across this stage, we send you out to think deeply, recognizing every square inch under God’s dominion. We invite you to wonder at each magnificent and intricate detail of creation, to understand passionately, even to the point of heartbreak, where things have gone wrong, and to envision a future hope of right relationships and restored beauty.

[Christ] is before all things, and in him all things hold together. For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.¹

ALL: Creator God, all glory belongs to you.

Faculty: We send you out to act justly, taking with you the knowledge, skills, and experience gained in the classroom, while studying abroad, on the turf, in music practice rooms, dorm basements, library carrels, and laboratories. Where there is hatred, sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; and where there is sadness, joy.

Seek the shalom and prosperity of the communities to which you now go. Pray to the LORD for them, because if they prosper, you too will prosper.²

ALL: God of justice and peace, all good things come from you.

Parent: We send you out to live wholeheartedly, into abounding delight, passion, and even challenge as those all produce faithfulness and character. You have blessed us your whole life, and as you graduate, we pray every blessing for you. We pray that you will serve passionately in your work. We pray that you will love others profoundly. We pray that you will be brave and wise and joyful. We pray that you will keep learning.

Offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.³

ALL: God who equips and sends, grant us all that we need to follow where you guide.

Graduate: We turn our gaze fully to the renewal of God's world. As Christ's agents of this work, we will design and build beautiful things, embrace the brokenhearted, call out injustice, and stand to fill the gaps of division and destruction. We will organize accounting spreadsheets and change hospital bed sheets; we will use our voices to sing and to advocate; we will teach, learn, and gather. As we go out, we take your gifts with us.

Learn to do right; seek justice. Defend the oppressed. Take up the cause of the fatherless; plead the case of the widow.⁴

ALL: God who creates and makes new, grant us courage and steadfastness as we join in your work.

Faculty: God who is, beginning and end, you call us to look to your kingdom amidst a world of confusion and certainty, doubt and discovery, trial and triumph.

Graduate: We are equipped, and we go confidently, knowing God’s hand of provision is also steady in the future.

Parent: *May the Lord direct your hearts into God’s love and Christ’s perseverance.*⁵

Trustee: *May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.*⁶

ALL: *Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful.*⁷

ADDITIONAL PATHS TO ACHIEVEMENT

Calvin Prison Initiative

Students in the Calvin Prison Initiative (CPI) program are able to earn associate's and bachelor's degrees from Calvin University. CPI is a partnership between Calvin University, Calvin Theological Seminary, and the Michigan Department of Corrections. The program provides a Christian liberal arts education to inmates at the Richard A. Handlon Correctional Facility in Ionia, Michigan. This five-year program culminates in a bachelor of arts degree from Calvin University in Faith and Community Leadership. On May 10, 2024, a formal Commencement ceremony honoring the 2024 graduating class of the CPI program will be held inside Handlon Correctional Facility.

Life and Career Studies

Life and Career Studies offers inclusive postsecondary education. Students earn four-year certificates from Calvin University in either Life and Career Studies or Comprehensive Postsecondary Education. The Life and Career Studies program is a collaboration between Calvin University and the Ready for Life organization.

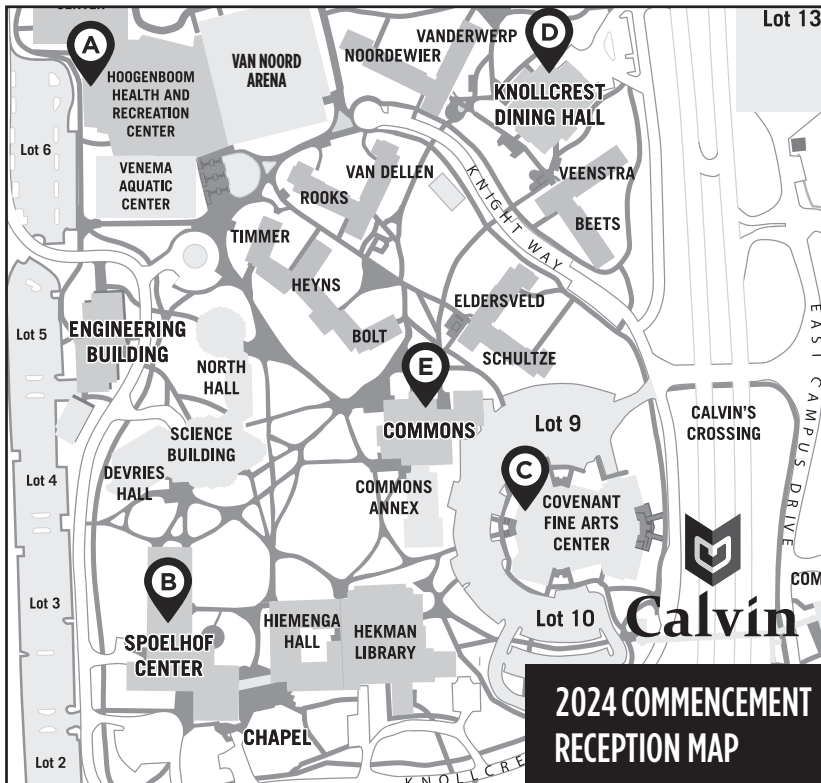

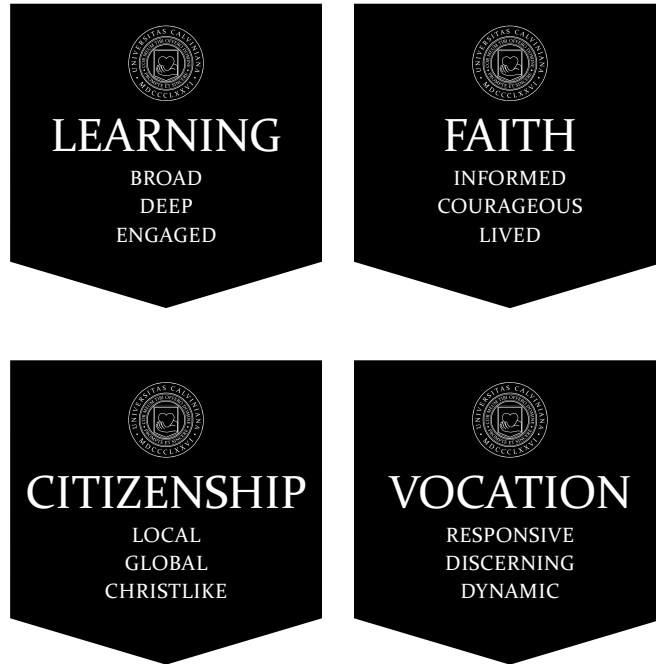

EDUCATIONAL FRAMEWORK

The mission of Calvin University is to equip students to think deeply, to act justly, and to live wholeheartedly as Christ’s agents of renewal in the world.

Calvin’s educational framework is derived from that mission. It articulates a frame that ensures integrated, coherent, holistic programs and practices in which students learn and develop. The framework names university-wide goals that ground the institution’s curricular and co-curricular activities. It attempts to answer the question, “What are the enduring characteristics or qualities of thinking, doing, and being that mark a Calvin University graduate?”

The four primary components of the educational framework are represented on the large banners hanging in the front of the arena.



STUDENT SPEAKER **Bear de Boo '24**

Bear de Boo is Calvin's current student body president. His multinational upbringing in Tokyo, Japan, and Leiden, the Netherlands, has equipped him with both a global mindset and the ability to

speak six different languages, which helps him pursue justice and change in a variety of settings, including in the political landscape.

During his time at Calvin, de Boo has served in leadership roles in Dance Guild, residence life, and Model United Nations. As student body president, he has prioritized Senate's involvement on campus, increasing student community, and working to make Student Senate more advocacy-based.

Outside of Calvin, de Boo interned as a student campaign strategist for a state representative as well as interned with a prominent political party leader in the Netherlands. De Boo says he continues to seek new challenges to expand his view on what a better world looks like, utilizing the communication, leadership, and social media skills he's further developed during his time at Calvin.

De Boo is an honors student graduating with a bachelor of arts in political science and history. This summer, he plans to start a new job in government and further pursue his goal of visiting every country in the world.



COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER **Arlene Hoogewerf**

Arlene Hoogewerf is dean of the school of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). She's held a dean's role at Calvin University for the past seven years. Since 2000, Hoogewerf has also

served as a faculty member in the biology department.

In her professorial role, Hoogewerf has taught a wide range of courses spanning three separate disciplines. She taught cell biology and genetics and microbiology in the biology program, nutrition in the health education program, and epidemiology in the public health program.

All of the courses Hoogewerf teaches are connected to preventative health, a long-time interest of hers. In fact, Hoogewerf has authored or co-authored more than 25 peer-reviewed publications in major journals that collectively have received more than 3,700 citations. She's also been the investigator or co-investigator on several grants from the NIH, NSF, Merck/AAAS, and Scholarship and Christianity in Oxford.

In all of this work, Hoogewerf has prioritized her undergraduate students, researching and co-authoring papers with them that have appeared in major publications.

Hoogewerf graduated from Calvin in 1986 with a bachelor of science in biology, and she earned her PhD in nutritional biochemistry in 1991 from Cornell University. Before returning to teach at her alma mater, she spent time as a post-doctoral fellow at UpJohn Company in Kalamazoo, Michigan, and at Glaxo Pharmaceutical Company in Geneva, Switzerland. She also worked for a few years as the director of the catalog products division at Midland Certified Reagent Company in Midland, Texas.

HIGHLIGHTS

FROM THE PAST FOUR YEARS

Following its inaugural year as a university, Calvin debuts as #3 out of 157 schools in the Midwest Regional Universities category as ranked in *U.S. News & World Report*.

Calvin announces a \$15 million gift to establish the School of Health. This significant gift is the second largest in Calvin's history.

Dance Guild, one of the largest on-campus student organizations, celebrates its 50th anniversary.

2020–2021

Calvin breaks ground on its School of Business building. The new 15,000-square foot building opens for fall 2022 classes.

A \$1.2 million U.S. Department of Education grant puts Calvin on a path to be the first university in Michigan to offer a Comprehensive Transition and Postsecondary Program for students with intellectual disabilities.

Calvin launches four new online master's programs. Today, more than 350 students are currently enrolled in Calvin's 12 graduate-level offerings.

In May 2022, Calvin awarded degrees to 76 students in a grand celebration inside Handlon Correctional Facility. It marked the first time in the state of Michigan that bachelor's degrees were awarded behind bars.

2021–2022

U.S. Department of Education leaders visit Calvin Prison Initiative Program and deem it a “leading exemplar” for prison education.

ArbNet designates Calvin’s campus as an arboretum. While having an arboretum on a college campus isn’t necessarily uncommon, having an entire campus designated that way is rare.

Nygil Likely is selected as Calvin’s chief diversity officer, a cabinet-level position created in 2015 by former president Michael Le Roy.

Students from more than 90 countries submit their applications to Calvin. The interest, which represents nearly half the countries in the world, is record-setting. In 2024, Calvin is building on that international footprint.

2023–2024

The board of trustees approves the university’s athletics strategic plan, which adds acrobatics & tumbling, men’s volleyball, and men’s football to its portfolio of NCAA Division III offerings.

Construction projects aimed at enhancing the student experience (phase one of the Commons Union project, new outdoor athletic facilities, School of Health enhancements including a new cadaver lab and expanded Speech Pathology & Audiology clinic) commence on campus.

The university launches the Wayfinder Program, the state of Michigan’s first Clemente Course in the Humanities, which is a transformative educational experience for adults facing economic and social barriers to higher education. The program will be offered off-campus in a neighboring zip code to Calvin.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The ceremonial costumes worn by faculty and graduates for Commencement have their roots in the Middle Ages, when European scholars wore robes, hoods, and caps to stay warm in unheated classrooms. Universities eventually adopted them as official everyday classroom uniforms to discourage “excess in apparel.” As the custom spread across Europe and into other areas, style differences emerged to designate each scholar’s institution, level of education, and (in the United States) field of study.

Today, the costume is reserved for ceremonial occasions. Faculty, staff, and students now wear regalia to honor the significance of this milestone in students’ lives. Gown and hood styles tell us something about each wearer’s degree.

Students receiving the bachelor’s degree today wear plain black gowns with pointed sleeves. The master’s gown (also black) has oblong sleeves, open at the wrist, with a longer base hanging down from the wrist opening. The doctor’s gown has bell sleeves, velvet facing, and three velvet bars on each sleeve. Though black is the traditional color and always appropriate for a doctoral gown, many professors wear the distinctive colors and styles of the universities that granted their degrees.

The longer the hood, the more advanced the degree. Master’s and doctor’s hoods have satin linings in the colors of the institution where the

degree was earned. The velvet edging color represents the wearer’s discipline. Though blue signifies philosophy and is therefore appropriate for any PhD (doctor of philosophy), universities in the United States also use these colors:

- White for arts and letters
- Light blue for education
- Drab (tan) for business
- Purple for law and political science
- Red for theology
- Gold for sciences
- Pink for music
- Crimson for communications
- Copper for economics
- Orange for engineering
- Brown for fine arts
- Apricot for nursing
- Green for physical education
- Salmon for public health

The flat cap, or mortar board, was originally worn by early medieval clergy and later adopted by medieval students and artists. The soft cap worn by some doctors was first adopted by monks to keep their tonsured heads warm.

In recent years, some students and faculty wear a kente cloth (a ceremonial woven stole with origins in 12th century Ghana) to honor African culture and/or leadership in the Center for Intercultural Student Development.



LATIN SEAL

The Latin heart-in-hand seal became the official emblem of Calvin University in 1933, but it emerged as early as 1910 in the university yearbook. However, the words *prompte et sincere* (promptly and sincerely) along with the image of an outstretched hand offering a heart surfaced four centuries earlier in the writings of the reformer John Calvin. He used the image to seal his letters in the 1540s. The motto *prompte et sincere* appears on his portrait dated 1566. The adoption of the words *Cor meum tibi offero Domine prompte et sincere* (My heart I offer, Lord, promptly and sincerely) and image together stand as the insignia of the university today, inspiring the Calvin community to practice the university's mission of thinking deeply, acting justly, and living wholeheartedly as Christ's agents of renewal in the world.

HONORS DESIGNATIONS

Collegiate Scholars Medallions

These gold medallions with a maroon ribbon are worn by students who have fulfilled the requirements to graduate with distinction. Requirements include the completion of four advanced academic or community engagement activities and a cumulative GPA of 3.65 or higher.

Honors Scholars Medallions

These gold medallions with a maroon and gold ribbon are worn by students who have completed the requirements to graduate with honors as Honors Scholars. Requirements include completion of the Honors Scholars core curriculum and an honors thesis and a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher.

Latin Honors Cords

These maroon and gold cords are worn by students who have earned one of the following Latin honors designations: *cum laude*—minimum 3.65 GPA, *magna cum laude*—minimum 3.8 GPA, *summa cum laude*—minimum 3.95 GPA.
